The county's favourable climate, and appealing physical, social, and economic characteristics offer promising opportunities for socioeconomic development and make it a preferred residential zone

Nairobi also serves as the country's main administrative hub, hosting the national government executive, the National Assembly, and the Senate, as well as diplomatic offices, International and multinational institutions, and other local, regional, and intercontinental dignitaries

Nairobi is home to major manufacturing firms, accounting for about 80% of the country's total industries

Own Source Revenue (OSR) accounted for 31% of FY 2022/23 Revenue

Recommendations

- Improvement in deepening own source revenue by digitising all county government processes to reduce dependence on the national government's quarterly distributions and address revenue leakages
- Strengthen compliance for established county laws and policies relating to climate change and enhance capacity building and awareness in climate change and green finance
- Embracing debt capital markets for infrastructure development financing

Key green projects



WATER HARVESTING, MANAGEMENT AND DISTRIBUTION
Water infrastructure and treatment plants expansion and solarization. Renovation and upgrading of the existing infrastructure to reduce non-revenue water.



INTEGRATED WASTE MANAGEMENT SYSTEM & RECYCLING CENTRE
Implementation of circular economy principles to reduce disposal costs while also generating additional revenue from sale of recyclable materials and compost.



ROAD INFRASTRUCTURE DEVELOPMENT AND MAINTENANCE
Implementation and completion of the Bus Rapid Transit (BRT) and Light Rail Transit (LRT) projects to improve public transportation and reduce traffic congestion in the City Centre.



AFFORDABLE HOUSING SCHEMES IN VARIOUS ESTATES (RENT-TO-OWN/SELL SCHEME)
Redeveloping County estates in Nairobi County as part of the Green Urban Renewal Project, which conform to the green building codes.

Governance structures

The County is in the final stages of enacting the Nairobi City County Climate Change Management Bill, 2023 which will guide the County on green/climate finance.

Presence of Nairobi's Climate Action Plan (CAP) 2020 - 2050, the Nairobi Metro 2030 Transport Plan and the Integrated Solid Waste Management Plan (ISWMP) for the City of Nairobi (2010)

The County will qualify for Financing Locally Led Climate Action (FLLoCA) funds upon enacting the County Climate Change Bill

Green assets

Water bodies: Nairobi River, Ngong River and Kabuthi River
Forests: Karura Forest, Ngong Forest, Uhuru Park, Nairobi Arboretum, Central Park, City Park, Jeevanjee Gardens and Kamukunji Gardens
